



Provincial Budget | 2025-26

We're delivering on the things you care about.

Affordability

- Reducing income taxes for every resident, family and small business in Saskatchewan.
- Delivering more than \$2 billion in affordability measures in every budget, in addition to more than \$250 million in tax savings introduced in the 2025-26 Budget.
- Education Property Tax mill rates are being reduced for all property classes.
- Introducing and maintaining made-in-Saskatchewan tax credits, incentives and programs designed to encourage investment and diversify the provincial economy.

Health care

- \$8.1 billion to deliver better patient access and safer, more responsive care for Saskatchewan residents.
- Increasing funding to accelerate the hiring and growth
 of health care professionals through the Health Human
 Resources Action Plan—the most ambitious program of
 its kind in Canada.

Education

- \$3.5 billion to deliver increased opportunities and support for K-12 students, parents and teachers across Saskatchewan.
- \$788 million in funding for post-secondary education to provide opportunities for students to pursue post-secondary studies close to home while focusing on programs that meet the needs of Saskatchewan's labour force and provincial economy.

Community safety

- Over the past two years (2024-25 and 2025-26)
 \$2 billion has been invested into community safety.
- More accessible court system for municipal bylaw offences.
- Record municipal revenue sharing of \$362 million, an increase of \$22 million.
- More than \$284.9 million in funding for First Nations and Métis Peoples and organizations.

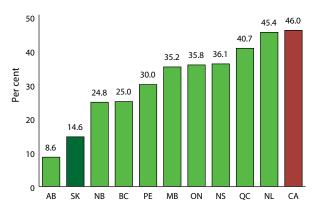
